Next, complete the following assignment for one of the books you read:

Novel Bag Presentation: Find an empty bag (grocery bag, lunch bag, etc.) You will fill the bag with five items related to your book in some way, write those items out on the index card, and then present your bag to the class. (A novel bag for Frozen might contain: gloves, a rock, a compass, carrots for Sven, and paper snowflakes). You will present your novel bags on the first Friday of the school year.

Part II: Read *From the Mixed-Up Files of Mrs. Basil E. Frankweiler* by E.L. Konigsburg. Then write a letter from a character. Compose a handwritten letter on notebook paper from any character in the book to anyone else. It can be to another character, a real person, a local newspaper, or anyone/anything you can think of. Your letter must be in the first person (use "I") and must include three details from the book. Remember, this will be my first impression of your writing and your school work in general, so do your best. Don't forget the signature! Letters are due on the first day of school.

We will discuss *From the Mixed-Up Files of Mrs. Basil E. Frankweiler* the first week of school. This book will introduce us to the mystery genre, and we will spend the first quarter reading, writing, and solving mysteries!
