

CULTIVATING CULTURE

THIS LETTER RECENTLY WENT OUT TO HIGH SCHOOL FAMILIES BEFORE THANKSGIVING

Thanksgiving is a cue to approach the altar of gratitude and exorcize our peevish complaints. My career has been a source of continuous fulfillment. It has been my primary calling. From that vocation, I derive purpose and legitimacy.

For the whole of my career, beginning as an English teacher, middle (most of it) as an administrator, and end in my current role, school is my dominant motive. It usually preempted conflicting commitments of marriage, parenthood, friendship, and civic responsibilities. I do not boast about the choices I have made in this regard. I have few regrets, though they don't stem from the eitheror proposition of work versus domestic duty. With my set of attributes, I was not able to perform two roles at once with full energy, attention, and time. Looking back, I do not gain clarity. I knew what I was doing.

So, it should not have come as a surprise to me when I found myself unhinged in the summer of 2020 (a COVID summer) and embarking on retirement, a.k.a, the road to oblivion. I do not claim this disdain or desperation is every retiree's lot. It was ineluctably mine, however.



And then six months later, along came a chance to work with Dr. Mitchell as he took the reins, in January 2021. As he and I and the administrative team developed trust, I spontaneously accepted the offer to serve as interim high-school principal while Will McCombs applied his substantial professional and personal assets to assist Susan Brooks in the leadership of the middle-school grades. In about a nano second, I shed the "interim" tag, which might as well have proclaimed "has no authority." For this opportunity, now in year three, I am profoundly grateful.

Our students are easy to like. They are reasonable, cheerful, unaffected, compliant, and welcoming. They like each other, they like their teachers, and their teachers like them (and their teachers like one another). A newcomer feels an immediate sense of belonging because of the warmth of our student body and faculty. These immensely attractive qualities and conditions are not universal in schools. In fact, they are the exception rather than the rule. When you have this culture, the main thing (in the Covey quotation that is boldly etched in my mind -"the main thing is to keep the main thing the main thing.") is to hang onto it tenaciously and cultivate it so that it doesn't become sterile. Culture is a sturdy thing. That's why turning a toxic culture around is a generational task. We will not fall back on its constitutional strength but honor and enrich this culture day by day.



EMBRACING SOMETHING GREATER


THIS CHRISTMAS

Dear First Baptist Families,

As we embrace the festive spirit of December, I wanted to provide some essential updates and reminders regarding our seniors' college application journey while also highlighting recent initiatives for our freshmen.

Senior College Applications:

Navigating the college application process can be overwhelming, but rest assured, I'm here to streamline and support your child's journey. Here are some crucial updates:

- **School Records and Deadlines:** For colleges listed in the "applied" column on SCOIR, all necessary school records will be sent by the application deadline. I'll ensure these submissions are timely and accurate.
- Q1 Grades and College Requests: Typically, Q1 grades aren't automatically sent unless requested by the college. If any college asks for these grades, please inform me promptly so I can facilitate the submission.
- Managing Applications on SCOIR: Once an application is submitted, kindly move the college to the "APPLIED" column on SCOIR. This action triggers an email notification to me, streamlining the follow-up process and sending the appropriate materials.
- Tracking Document Submission: Monitoring document submissions is crucial. Use the "My Colleges" section on SCOIR to check the status, remember that I may have sent your transcript via Common App. Some colleges require self-reporting via their portals. Keep an eye out in your email.
- **Updates on College Decisions:** As colleges respond—acceptances, denials, deferrals, or waitlists—please update these on SCOIR. This helps me track progress and provide necessary support.
- **Financial Aid and Scholarships:** Keep an eye on financial aid and scholarship deadlines. I'll personally meet with all seniors this month to ensure they're aware of available scholarships.

Freshmen Academic Support:

Throughout the month of November, I had the pleasure of meeting with all freshmen individually to discuss important aspects:

- **Transcripts and Activities Tracking:** We discussed the importance of maintaining a strong transcript and keeping track of extracurricular activities, setting a strong foundation for their academic journey.
- Academic Support and Course Selection: Ensuring they're equipped with academic support and guidance for selecting courses for the upcoming year. Keep in mind, teachers and administrators also play a huge role in that process with their recommendations.

I recognize that this period can be a blend of excitement and stress for your child and your family. Please remember that our counseling department is dedicated to supporting and guiding you through this journey. Should you have any questions or concerns, feel free to reach out.
