

Technology Talk

FROM THE FBS TECHNOLOGY COMMITTEE

First Baptist School's Technology Committee highlights important trends and information in each newsletter. This installment speaks to two different groups of parents: those with children in 7th grade and younger and those with children in 8th grade and older.

In recent years, the movement "Wait til 8th" has gained traction and First Baptist is proud to encourage parents and students to join. If you are unfamiliar with the concept, "Wait Til 8th" helps students and parents alike remember one simple fact: kids don't need smartphones to thrive. Parents who choose to join the "Wait Til 8th" group pledge to delay giving their children a smartphone until at least 8th grade, allowing children more time to develop social skills, self control, and confidence without the constant pressures of social media and group chats. By waiting, families can protect kids from distractions, online risks, and the mental health struggles that often come with early exposure to digital life. Many parents find strength in joining the movement together—removing the pressure to "keep up" and helping kids just be kids a little longer.

For parents of older students (8th–12th grade), one of the healthiest tech habits you can encourage is keeping phones out of bedrooms at night. Late-night scrolling can rob teens of sleep, increase anxiety, and make it harder for them to focus at school. Charging phones in a central spot—like the kitchen—sets a clear boundary while modeling balance and self-control. It's a simple change with a big payoff: better rest, more meaningful conversations, and a calmer, more focused start to each day. Of course, it's difficult to convince a teenager to relinquish his or her cell phone at the end of the day. Often, students remember last minute assignments and complete them on their phones while in bed - but it's hard for teenagers to stop scrolling once they start (just as it is for adults!). Cells phones are neither good nor bad; they are neutral. But our use of (and how we teach our kids to use phones) can be positive or negative, and putting phones away at night is the first step in teaching positive habits, which will travel with your teen throughout his or her life.

As we move into this season of gratitude, I want to take a moment to celebrate our seniors and all the hard work they've been putting in this fall. A big shout-out to those who have completed their college applications or are in the final stages of submission, and congratulations to those who have already received acceptance letters! I know this process can feel overwhelming at times, but please remember that you are not alone. Stay focused and finish strong; each step brings you closer to exciting new opportunities ahead. As financial aid and scholarship applications begin, I encourage you to stay organized, meet deadlines, and reach out to me with any questions along the way. You're doing great work, and your persistence will pay off.

For our freshmen, your time is **now**! You will soon be directed to sign-up and attend an Individual Career Planning meeting with me. These meetings with your counselor will happen every year, and will always be focused on developing the future you want for yourself. During this first session, we'll take a closer look at what's included on a high school transcript, why it matters, and how it plays a role in future opportunities. We'll also talk about the habits that make high school students successful and begin exploring each student's strengths and career interests. Freshmen should come prepared to reflect on their goals and the unique gifts they bring to the classroom and beyond.

For our sophomores, this season is a great time to continue building strong academic habits and to start refining thoughts about future careers. Think about the kinds of jobs that excite you and what type of education or training those paths may require. We'll begin formal Individual Career Planning meetings in the spring, but this is the perfect time to start exploring possibilities and dreaming big!

For our juniors, we'll begin Individual Career Planning meetings after we return from Winter Break. Right now, the most important thing you can do to keep future options open is to stay focused and do your best in your current courses. Strong grades this year make a big difference when it comes to college and/or career opportunities. A special shout-out to those who have taken advantage of recent college visits... keep exploring! Don't forget about our upcoming Junior College Trip on February 25 - 27. We'll host an informational session about the trip on the James Island campus on November 10, and I hope to see all juniors and their families there.

I am so thankful for the opportunity to work with such a motivated group of students and supportive families. Wishing everyone a restful, joy-filled, and gratitude-centered Thanksgiving season!


