
11TH GRADE ENGLISH: BRITISH LITERATURE

Book One: *The Strange Case of Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde* by Robert Louise Stevenson (a link to this text has been provided above, yet you do not have to purchase that exact version. Any version of this text is acceptable.)

You do not have a written assignment for this novel. However, as you read, pay particular attention to the dualities present in the text, and annotate the text. Finally, you will be assessed on the novel during the first week of school. Be prepared!

Book Two: Choose a memoir/biography of an individual from England, or Scotland

When you choose your person, CHOOSE SOMEONE YOU FIND INTERESTING. You may choose someone from any time period in British/Irish/Scottish history. Your choices range from Winston Churchill to J.K. Rowling, from William Wallace to Queen Victoria. Please remember that it is your responsibility to verify the nationality of your individual. If you are unsure, please email me.

Once you have completed your text, complete the following assignment: write a 300 word reflection on your individual. What did you find interesting? Strange? Inspiring? Fascinating? Your reflection should be in MLA format and may be in the first person. While this assignment is short, it serves as your first writing sample. Your reflection should be typed, printed, and submitted the first day of class. If your reflection is not turned in on time, your grade will be severely penalized.
