

Post Algebra 3 Summer Math 2019-2020

This year, we will be using Khan Academy to complete our summer practice. Each student will have an individual profile within the summer “class”. This will enable the teacher to monitor the students’ progress throughout the summer, make recommendations to individual students if necessary, and assess the students’ learning at the end of the summer. **Students must join the Post Algebra 3 Summer 2019 class to access and receive credit for the activities.**

To join the Post Algebra 3 Summer 2019 class, follow these instructions:

1. Sign up at khanacademy.org (or log in if you already have an account).
2. Visit khanacademy.org/coaches (or click the “Coaches” tab in your profile).
3. In the “Join A Class” field, enter the following class code: **HE3KH3RW**
4. Go to the “Assignments” tab to see the activities you are to complete.

The activities assigned are concepts that were covered in Algebra 2 and Algebra 3, so students may find it helpful to use class notes to complete them. Students may also click to access any of the hints, articles, or videos found on Khan Academy related to the activities.

Completion of the summer packet is **optional**; however, there are benefits to doing so. First, it will help you stay fresh on the concepts covered in Algebra 2 and Algebra 3, and fill in some gaps in your memory. Also, it will help you start the year off strong with a good grade on the Summer Work Test, scheduled for the first week of the new school year. To encourage you to complete the packet, you will receive a **TEN POINT BONUS** on the test if you have:

1. Completed all assignments assigned to the summer class
2. Completed “Level 1” for all topics assigned.

To get the most out of the summer packet, I strongly recommend that you do one or two assignments each week, rather than cramming work into the first or last week or two of the summer.

If you have any problems signing up or accessing the assignments, you may email Mr. Snider at snidera@fbschool.org. Please keep in mind that the summer work is meant to be completed independently by the student, so students should use the tools provided within Khan Academy (hints, videos, articles, etc.) for questions about content. Teachers will not provide concept-specific help through email over the summer.
